 **The War of the Roses**

began with the anti-suffrage forces wearing red roses to depict femininity and their efforts "to save Southern womanhood." The pro-suffrage forces countered with yellow. The yellow rose was prevalent in suffrage imagery. Susan B. Anthony was identified with the yellow rose of suffrage.

Women in long white dresses filled the Hermitage Hotel and halls of the Tennessee capitol, working tirelessly to achieve their goal. When they marched, their purple sashes symbolized justice.
