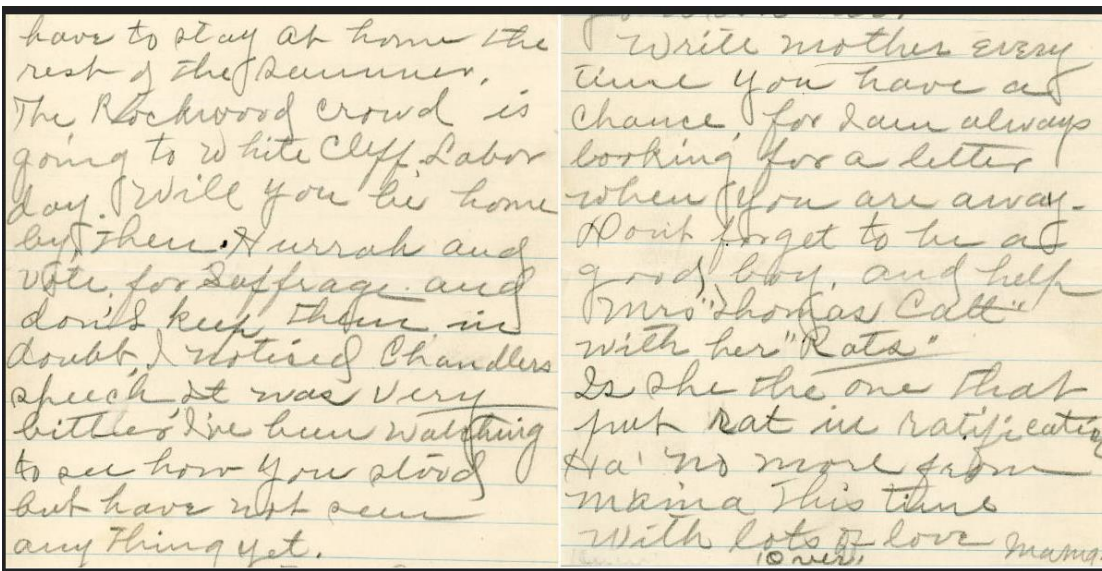

Text of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States:

The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex.

Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.



Excerpt of letter to Harry Burn, McMinn County Representative to the Tennessee State Legislature in 1920, from his mother: *...Hurrah and vote for suffrage and don't keep them in doubt. I noticed Chandler's speech, it was very bitter I've been watching to see how you stood but have not seen anything yet. Write mother every time you have a chance for I am always looking for a letter when you are away. Don't forget to be a good boy. And help Mrs. "Thomas Catt" with her "Rats." Is she the one that put rat in ratification Ha...*
